On a national level, John has been an active leader in the [ACC Value Challenge](http://www.acc.com), establishing a task force for Georgia law firms to exchange ideas on alternative billing. He has further spearheaded the Chapter’s initiative to support its members in transition with increased networking and career enhancement opportunities, and established a pilot program whereby two members in transition receive a stipend to intern with a local pro bono organization. He has also co-authored articles for the *ACC Docket* and serves on the publication’s Advisory Board, and has served as a panelist at past ACC Annual Meetings.
