SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

WMACCA – the regional chapter of the Association of Corporate Counsel – is very pleased to invite students from Washington, D.C., Virginia and Maryland law schools to apply to participate in the seventh year of its WMACCA Corporate Scholars Program, which offers summer internships in the legal departments of prestigious local companies and organizations. This Program was established with the support of the Minority Corporate Counsel Association (MCCA), WMACCA, and corporate and individual donors.

The Corporate Scholars Program is designed to give students from the law schools in our region the opportunity to experience in-house practice. This is also a “diversity pipeline” program. We hope to get applications from populations that may otherwise lack access to these opportunities. In the summer of 2010, WMACCA plans to provide eight (8) to ten (10) summer internships at in-house legal departments. These internships will provide substantive experience and meaningful exposure to in-house practice. We solicit the internships from General Counsels who are WMACCA members, and we expect to get a terrific response. The companies and organizations that have provided internships during the previous six summers include: Sodexo Inc., US Airways, the United States Chamber of Commerce, TV One, Verizon Business, TV One, Public Broadcasting Service, XO Communications, IBM, CSC, Carey International, Strayer University and Lockheed Martin.

These opportunities are open to students who will be 2Ls and 3Ls in fall 2010, and students in both full-time and part-time programs. The internships will last for a minimum of ten (10) weeks and must begin no later than June 1, 2010. In 2009, participants received a scholarship award of \$9,000. The 2010 awards will be at least \$9,000 per student.

If you are interested in applying for the WMACCA Corporate Scholars Program, you will be able to find additional information in your school’s career services office. **We will take applications on a rolling basis, but the application must be postmarked no later than January 20, 2009.** Information also is posted on the WMACCA Web page at <http://wmacca.acc.com>
