As the commercial lawyer for four business units at Associated British
Foods as well as managing intellectual property matters for the Asia Pacific
region, Will is always kept on his toes in a complex and ever changing
environment. This included having to advise on changes to the Plumbing
Code of Australia to ensure that a multi-million dollar deal wasn't derailed
after over 12 months of negotiations. As a testament to Will's potential, he
is one of 55 employees chosen out of ABF's 137,000 employees to take

senior talent.
