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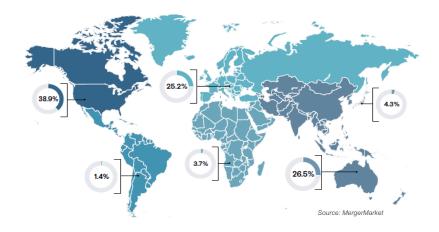
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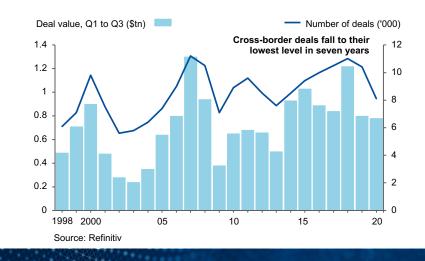
M&A Outlook



- Global M&A deal volume totaled \$1.8 trillion, a -28% drop compared to Q1-Q3 2019
- Cross-border deals are at their lowest level in seven years, due in part to travel restrictions, trade tensions and nationalist economic sentiments
