- 1) new in-house GC, what to look for as far as red flags, self-audit; 2) what are all the things that in-house counsel/GC can do to prepare and reduce risks BEFORE there is a problem? and 3) been served, then what?
- How to defeat shareholder suits and attempts to enjoin votes to approve mergers when plaintiffs' firms have an MO to just extract a ransom (fees).
- The first topic would explore the landmines of utilizing generative AI; the second two topics would explore of how foreign jurisdiction's laws impact discovery and the cross border transfer of data.
- The tri-partite relationship between an insured and insurance appointed counsel, including third-party payer privilege and control of litigation is always an area of contention, and conflict. Rules vary widely by jurisdiction, and insurers. A program focused on the rights of an insured, best practices in selecting and managing appointed counsel, the role of cover/personal counsel would be very helpful for in-house lawyers.
- Expecting businesses to hold themselves accountable and resolve disputes autonomously might seem unrealistic, especially when court dockets are full and regulatory oversight is increasing. However, independent industry self-regulation, when developed and implemented properly, is a powerful tool for enhancing consumer trust in business and protecting consumers. An often-overlooked component of a successful self-regulatory model is the role of alternative dispute resolution (ADR) in allowing businesses to resolve conflicts. In this session, seasoned in-house leaders will discuss how industry self-regulation and ADR can help solve vexing business problems and how in-house counsel can play an important leadership role in those efforts.
