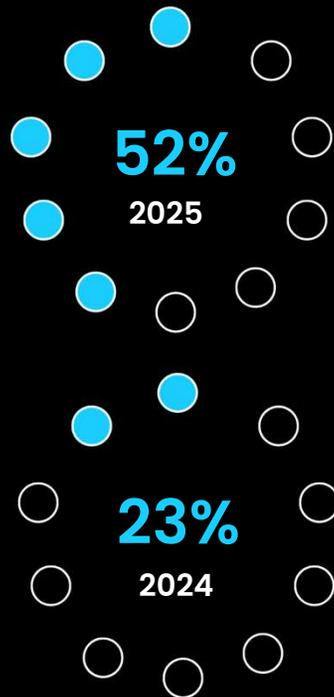
AI in the in-house legal world today

From a global survey conducted by ACC in November 2025

The use of GenAI among in-house legal departments has more than **doubled** in the past year



Areas where respondents believe AI will be most effective



82% of 2025's respondents are still concerned about AI's quality and reliability

What challenges can AI solve?

83% of corporate legal departments expect demand for legal work to increase, with 63% citing workload and bandwidth as their top operational challenge.



- **Time pressures** from higher contract volumes and faster deal cycle requirements
- **Responsiveness** to legal queries
- More **high-volume**, low-risk contracts that require legal's time but not legal's strategic knowledge
- **Consistency** of clause redrafts and negotiations
- Post-signature data and risk **visibility** for the whole company

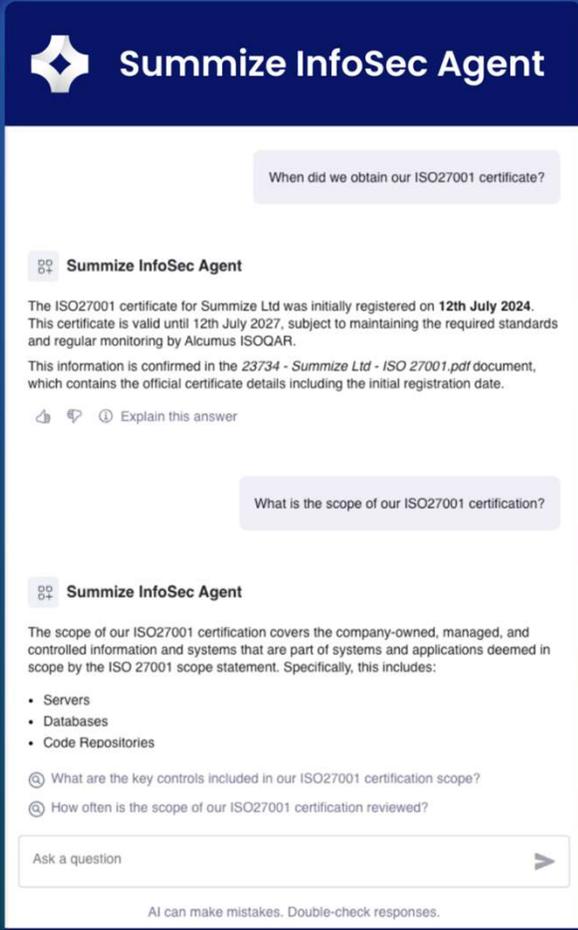

What AI isn't good for and where to be cautious

Where AI should NOT be used

There are clear limits to where AI should be used responsibly. In 2023, the American Bar Association issued Formal Opinion 512, stating that lawyers have to “reasonably supervise” AI tools and verify all outputs.



AI should NOT be relied upon for:

- **Complex judgment calls** that require contextual, ethical, or professional discretion
- **High-risk scenarios** where errors could have legal, financial, or reputational consequences
- **Strategic decisions** that involve long-term planning, nuanced stakeholder considerations, or incomplete information



Pitfalls of AI

Striking the right balance

AI tools are most effective when used to support a lawyer's expertise:

- 1** Drafting, summarizing and structuring information
- 2** Identifying trends or highlighting potential issues
- 3** Improving speed and consistency in routine tasks

However...

- 1** AI does not apply professional judgment
- 2** AI cannot assess risk appetite, organizational culture or ethical impact
- 3** Final accountability and decision-making must always sit with the lawyer



What to be mindful of

When to use general-purpose AI or purpose-built AI tools

General-purpose:

- Tools like ChatGPT for ideation
- Generating first drafts or non-confidential wording

Purpose-built:

- Tools like Summize embed legal knowledge and compliance into every step
- Enabling faster and more complaint processes, trained on JUST your data and nuances

AI security and mandates

What to look out:

- Siloed AI practices
- Encrypted environments with strict access controls
- Data residency options to meet regional regulatory requirements

Questions to ask for your AI mandate:

- Can the data be used for training?
- How are you validating AI content?
- What are the regulations in the countries you operate in?

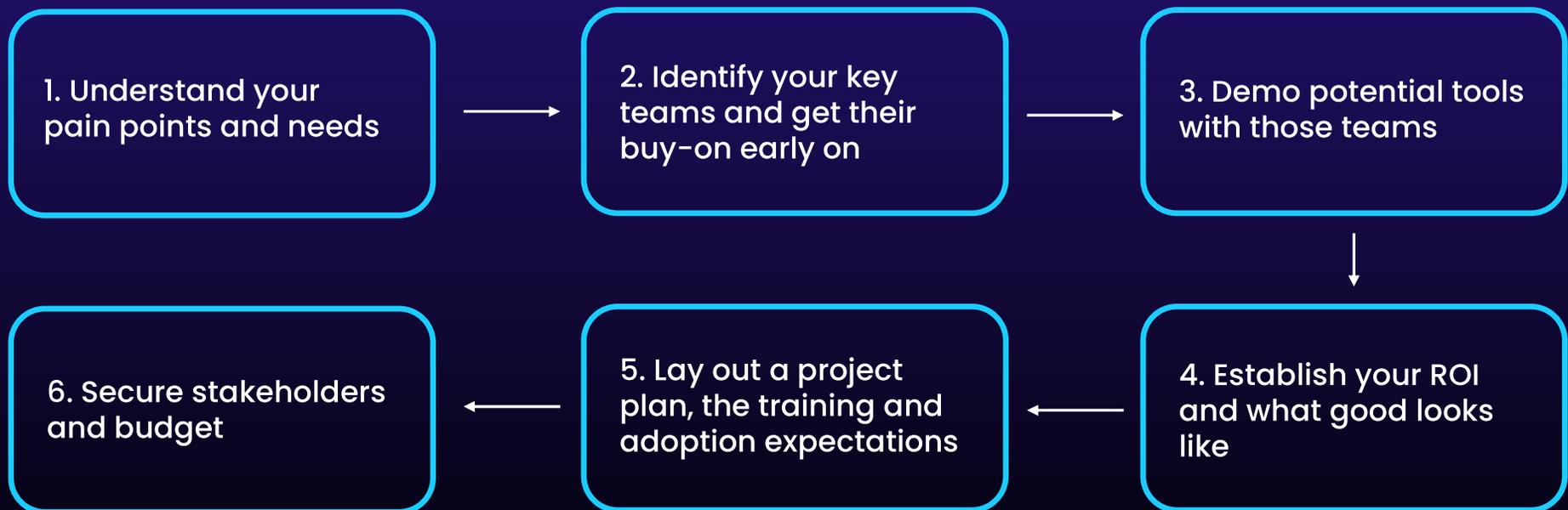
