Re: Association of Corporate Counsel Supports Proposed Changes to Admission Rule XIV, on Foreign Legal Consultants in Texas

Dear Chief Justice Hecht:

The Association of Corporate Counsel¹ strongly urges the Supreme Court of Texas to adopt Admission Rule XIV, which expands the role of foreign in-house counsel in Texas.

The rule contains two elements that are crucial to in-house lawyers. *First*, the proposal provides an explicit path for companies to hire foreign legal consultants as in-house lawyers. *See* Proposed Rule XIV, Section (1)(b)(4). *Second*, and equally important, the proposal recognizes that different countries authorize lawyers to practice using different systems. Therefore, the proposal is not limited to lawyers from countries that authorize lawyers in the same way as the U.S. Rather, the proposed rule simply asks the relevant question of whether the lawyers' home countries have authorized them to practice law. *See* Proposed Rule XIV, Section (1)(b)(1)(A).
