Initial Steps

Things to Think About Before Raising Your Hand

- Time Commitment guest speaker
- Time Commitment teach 1 class of 1-2 semester course
- Time Commitment full 1-2 semester course (13-14 weeks)
 - Preparation time for weekly class (3-6 hours)
 - Class time (2-3 hours/week)
 - Office Hours (2 hours/week)
 - Grading & Admin (15-20 hours)





Develop the Focus and Structure of Your Course

Getting Your Course Idea Approved

- Explore relevant curriculum and classes
- Ask for help from current faculty members
- Is your topic unique? A new take on current topic?
- Proposal provided to Dean or Curriculum Committee
- Submit proposal a year in advance
- Follow up as needed after submission



Practical Tips

- Co-teachers, Guest speakers
- Expectations clear: attendance, participation, absences
- Rethink reading levels is it all essential?
- Encourage engagement
- Office hours before/after class
- Ask for and act on feedback
- Don't forget to use resources from ACC and the school
