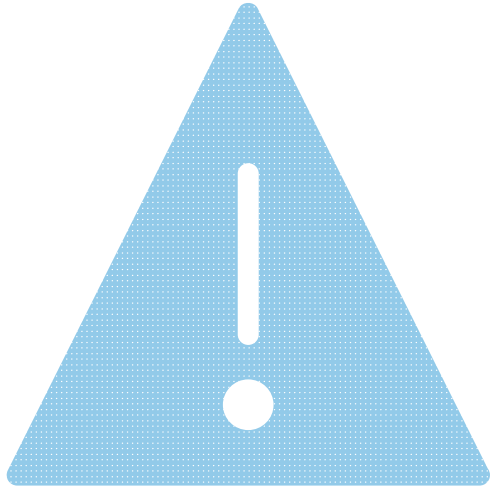
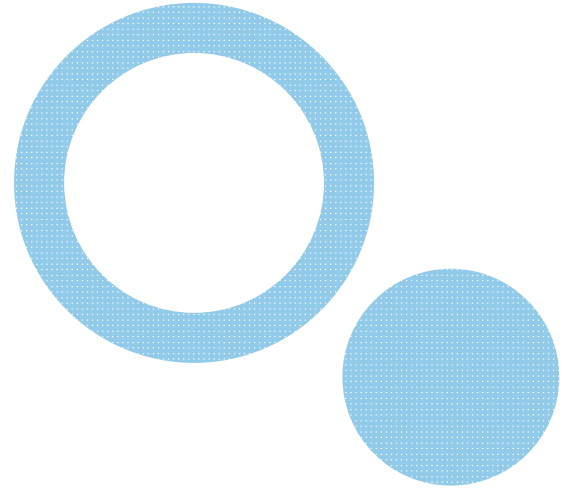

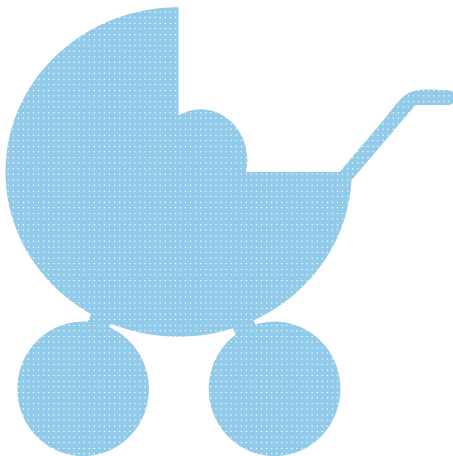
Word of mouth...

According to the *ACC Foundation: The State of Cybersecurity Report An In-house Perspective*, 44 percent of respondents who reported experiencing a data breach in the past two years were informed of the event by a member of the IT department. Alternatively, 14 percent of respondents noted that they were alerted of the breach by the compliance department.



Out of your hands...

Five percent of CLOs in law departments of 50 employees or more reported spending the majority of their time over the past year managing outside counsel, according to the *ACC Chief Legal Officers 2015 Survey*. This compares to the 26 percent of CLOs in law departments of 25 employees or less that reported needing the same requirement.



Striking a balance...

Compliance and ethics (44 percent), technology (47 percent), real estate (42 percent), and employment and labor (42 percent) are the four industries where lawyers are most likely to consider searching for another role as a result of being a caregiver or working parent, according to the *2014 ACC Global Work-life Balance Report*.



An added bonus...

Corporate lawyers in larger companies are more likely to receive a cash bonus, according to the *2015 ACC Global Census Report A Profile of In-house Counsel*. More than three-quarters of in-house counsel in organizations with 50,000 or more people reported receiving a cash bonus in addition to their base salary. In organizations with fewer than 500 employees, just over half received a cash bonus.
